Back to School

It's school time and kids are once again walking, biking, and riding the bus to get there.

Please be ever vigilant to watch for pedestrians in the neighborhood, especially since we don't have sidewalks.

Be courteous to school bus drivers and the children in their care— if the red lights are flashing and the stop sign is out, you need to stop and wait. Both directions of traffic need to stop for school buses. The only exception is on divided highways. Stop on red. There are kids ahead. Not stopping is punishable by law.

The neighborhood speed limit is 20mph. Please slow down for everyone's

safety. Remind your teenage drivers to follow these rules as well to keep everyone safe.

Outside of our neighborhood, please be mindful to drive slowly and allow children safe passage when crossing streets on their way to school.

While the bridge is under construction for the pedestrian trail, there is no bridge access for pedestrians. Please take your kids to Flint Hills Christian School (FHCS) instead of allowing them to walk. It's not safe with the lanes being narrowed for construction

The school zone in front of FHCS lowers the speed to 20mph (same as our neighborhood) from 7:30-8:30am and 3-4pm. Please slow down during those times.

Construction Zone

Construction for the pedestrian trail is ongoing. Because of narrow lanes, there is to be no pedestrian traffic on the bridge right now.

Additionally, the construction zone is not a play area. Please discourage any and all play in the construction area.

There are just too many dangers. It is a steep drop into the creek. The construction equipment is heavy and can cause serious injury.

While the dirt piles and ridgeline may be very tempting on which to play, it's a no-go zone for play.

Sweep up Grass Clippings

As a courtesy to neighbors and to keep our neighborhood looking at its best, please remove grass clippings from the street.

Either sweep/blow clippings into your yard or dispose in a trash/compost receptacle.

The clumps of grass in the street are visually unappealing. Clippings also impede water flow and clog water drains.

House and Shed Roofs

Sheds must be architecturally similar to houses. Therefore, their roofs must match. If you have a shed in your backyard, please make sure the roof matches that of your house.

This has been a bigger issue lately with all the roof replacements in the neighborhood.

ACC Approval for Outdoor Projects

According to our neighborhood covenants, no building, structure, or improvement including, but not limited to fences. sheds, and major landscaping, shall be constructed nor shall any exterior addition, change, or alteration thereto be made until proposed improvement plans have been submitted and approved in writing by the Architectural Control Committee

In other words, in order to build a fence or shed, you need to submit your plan and have it approved by the ACC. Also, if you are changing the exterior in any way, such as roofing, painting or new siding, you need to submit your plan and have it approved by the ACC first.

Approval by the ACC needs to occur before you begin any construction or changes to your lot.

Our ACC tries to get back with homeowners within a reasonable time frame, but please remember that those on the ACC are volunteering their time and have fulltime jobs and other commitments outside their role in the ACC.

We appreciate being sent your Improvement Request Form (located on the documents page of our website) with advanced notice. Please remember the old adage, "failure to plan on your part, does not constitute an emergency on ours." With that said, we strive to reply quickly and work within your construction time line.
